INF 19/09 INFORMATION NOTE:- NATIONAL FUNERAL FOR THE LATE MR HOPE WEBSTER IN RECOGNITION OF HIS INVALUABLE CONTRIBUTION TO ANGUILLA DURING THE REVOLUTION

Hon Parliamentary Secretary, Ministerial Assistant to the Hon Minister, MHA and Financial Specialist remained.

Council noted the passing of Mr Hope Webster, resident of Island Harbour on Sunday, 27 October 2019.

Mr Hope Webster was a staunch supporter of the Leader of the Anguilla Revolution, Mr James Ronald Webster. He was known to have had a good working relationship with Mr J. R. Webster and other leaders of the Revolution, and was recognized as one of Mr Webster's key advisors and a great soldier of the Revolution.

Mr Webster was awarded the Anguilla Badge of Honour and Queen's Certificate in 2003 for his contribution to the Anguilla Revolution.

Council further noted that in keeping with EX MIN 14/612 (vii) and EX MIN 15/535, the Premier's Office has therefore begun the process of making arrangements which would include:

- (i) the holding of a National Funeral for the late Mr. Hope Webster in collaboration with the family;
- (ii) the publication of an official Statement of Condolence from the Government and people of Anguilla on the passing of this outstanding revolutionary;
- (iii) flags to be flown at half-mast on the day preceding the funeral and on the day of the funeral immediately following the funeral ceremony;
- (iv) a Police Guard of Honour to be drawn up at the Church and a contingent of uniformed officers to bear the body in and out of the church and at the graveside. Casket to be covered with the national flag; and
- (v) a contribution of EC\$5,000.00 towards the cost of the funeral expenses and EC\$3,000.00 towards the other expenses.

Council authorised the issue of the action sheet before confirmation of the minutes.
